The Beauty of Yugen that is Performed by a Gem of Tradditional Woodblock Prints Nogaku Hyaku-ban (one hundred Noh play) Spring Exhibition Birthday Memorial **Spring Exhibition** 6.16 sun rsukioka Kō Last year, as Meiji 150th Year memorial exhibition, we introduced the traditional woodblock prints in Meiji period which are rated higher recently. In the exhibition, the ukiyo-e by Tsukioka Yoshitoshi or kachō-ga (prints of flowers, birds or living things except human being) by Ohara Koson were included. In this spring, we exhibit a luxurious woodblock print series "Nogaku Hyaku-ban" which was created by Tsukioka Kōgyo from Taishō 11th to 15th (1922~1926). This series is a gorgeous woodblock prints with high quality washi papers and several tens of times of suri (printing) that re-express not only his brushwork but also his color. Some were printed using gold and/or silver. This series excellently expressed the elegance and mysterious atmosphere of Noh play.

The great idea and artistic character that are veiled in Noh play give

huge impact and impression to us who live in the present age. In this

exhibition, we put brief explanations or referential books of Noh play

and you can know many stories while watching the prints. Please

enjoy the world of Yūgen (mysterious, subtle and profound) of Noh

Teika's infatuation for an Imperial princess Shokushi became 'Teika Kazura' (Teika's kudzu vine), twined around her grave and has been tormenting her. By the monk's sutra-chanting, she is released by the vine and dances for the appreciation. But she disappears into the grave that the vine twined around like be buried among his love.

We also exhibit a little of modern woodblock prints that linked to "Nogaku Hyaku-ban", such as the art works by Ohara Koson who was featured in NHK TV program and became the topic of conversation year

Tsukioka Kōgyo (1869 ~ 1927)

Kōgyo studied under Ogata Gekkō, Matumoto Hūko and others who were a *nihon-ga-ka* (Japanese-style painting artist) and won many prizes. The last *ukiyo-e-shi* (*ukiyo-e* artist) Tsukioka Yoshitoshi is his stepfather. From around Meiji 30s, Kōgyo began to be overwhelmed with Noh painting and played an active role as a specialist in the field. His art works are housed in National Noh Theater, Tokyo National Museum and other museums in and outside Japan. His book of prints and paintings is published in abroad.



Shizuka-gozen who was a mistress of Yoshitsune and a woman who is possessed by the spirit of Shizuka-gozen talk about the vicissitudes of life and dance together.

"all things are all same, originally" is an outlook on Buddhism that Ono-no Komachi preaches at the age of 100.
